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Introduction

Southern University – Baton Rouge (SUBR) is responsible for justifying and keeping a record of the qualifications of its faculty. The purpose of the Faculty Qualifications and Credentialing Manual is to provide information about the credentialing and verification process for faculty members at SUBR. Both full-time and adjunct/part-time instructors of record (teaching faculty) must possess the appropriate credentials in the respective teaching discipline. They must also possess credentials in the specific area/topic being taught and meet or exceed the minimum requirements of SUBR policies.

SACSCOC Principles of Accreditation

The Southern Association of Colleges and School Commission of Colleges and Schools (SACSCOC) operates to assure educational quality and improve the effectiveness of its member institutions, of which SUBR is one. Member institutions must demonstrate compliance with *The Principles of Accreditation*, which entails fourteen (14) sections each with related standards.

It is imperative that faculty members and all other stakeholders understand that accreditation is critical to SUBR. It determines eligibility for Title IV funds (student financial aid) and qualifies the university and enrolled students for access to federal funds to support teaching, research, and student financial aid. Thus, adherence to its standards is paramount.

SACSCOC Principles and Guidelines Related to Faculty

Section 6: Faculty (from SACSCOC *Principles of Accreditation*):

Qualified, effective faculty members are essential to carry out the mission of the institution and to ensure the quality and integrity of its academic programs. The tradition of shared governance within American higher education recognizes the importance of both faculty and administrative involvement in the approval of educational programs. Because student learning is central to the institution's mission and educational degrees, the faculty has responsibility for directing the learning enterprise including overseeing and coordinating educational programs to ensure that each contains essential curricular components, has appropriate content and pedagogy, and maintains discipline currency. Achievement of the institution's mission with respect to teaching, research, and service requires a critical mass of full-time qualified faculty to provide direction and oversight of the academic programs. Due to this significant role, it is imperative that an effective system of evaluation be in place for all faculty members that takes into account the institution's obligations to foster intellectual freedom of faculty to teach, serve, research, and publish.

6.1. The institution employs an adequate number of full-time faculty members to support the mission and goals of the institution. (Full-time faculty) [CR]

6.2. For each of its educational programs, the institution:

6.2.a. justifies and documents the qualifications of its faculty members.
(Faculty qualifications)

6.2.b. employs a sufficient number of full-time faculty members to ensure curriculum and program quality, integrity, and review.
(Program faculty)

6.2.c. assigns appropriate responsibility for program coordination.
(Program coordination)

6.3. The institution publishes and implements policies regarding the appointment, employment, and regular evaluation of faculty members, regardless of contract or tenure status. (Faculty appointment and evaluation)

6.4. The institution publishes and implements appropriate policies and procedures for preserving and protecting academic freedom. (Academic freedom)

6.5. The institution provides ongoing professional development opportunities for faculty members as teachers, scholars, and practitioners, consistent with the institutional mission. (Faculty development)

Southern University Guidelines for Faculty Credentials:

In alignment with SACSCOC guidelines for credentialing, Southern University determines faculty qualifications using faculty credentials and employs the following as credentialing guidelines:

a. Faculty teaching general education courses at the undergraduate level: doctorate or master's degree in the teaching discipline or master's degree with a concentration in the teaching discipline (a minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline).

b. Faculty teaching baccalaureate courses: doctorate or master's degree in the teaching discipline or master's degree with a concentration in the teaching discipline (minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline).

c. Faculty teaching graduate and post-baccalaureate course work: earned doctorate/terminal degree in the teaching discipline.

d. Graduate teaching assistants: master's in the teaching discipline or 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline, direct supervision by a faculty member experienced in the teaching discipline, regular in-service training, and planned and periodic evaluations. Graduate teaching assistants may only teach undergraduate courses unless they have earned a terminal degree in the teaching discipline.

Justification for Exceptions

Southern University recognizes that some potential faculty members who are best suited to serve the needs of SUBR students may not have taken the typical academic route to developing her or his ability to effectively teach a particular subject. As explained in the SACSCOC Resource Manual for The Principles of Accreditation (2018): "While academic credentials in most cases may well be the standard qualification for faculty members, other types of qualifications may prove to be appropriate. Examples could include appropriately related work experiences in the field, professional licensure and certifications related to the teaching assignment, honors and awards, continuing professional development, relevant peer-reviewed publications, and/or continuous documented excellence in teaching."

A request for exception is course-specific and requires major documentation for each proposed course assignment. A written petition justifying that the individuals' credentials reflect a level of preparation that is comparable to that of a person holding a graduate degree in the teaching field or documentation of how the faculty member's experience and accomplishments have prepared the individual to effectively deliver the instructional assignment based on the learning outcomes of the course must be approved by the College Dean and Academic Affairs.

Faculty teaching Less Commonly Taught Languages (LCTL) such as Swahili, Arabic, or Turkish, who have not earned 18 graduate hours in the LCTL, must possess a master's degree, demonstrate native fluency in the language, and provide other qualifying documentation that reflects the individual's preparation for teaching the specific language course. Upon approval by the College Dean and Academic Affairs, such faculty are restricted to teaching the lowest level introductory or conversational level courses.
